Curriculum Updates - Term One:

English:

In Writing, students will be encouraged to use familiar words, phrases and images to convey ideas throughout the *Independent*



Writing Process. Children understand that *writing is thinking* and when we write we are putting our thoughts on to paper. Individual students will use various strategies and resources to support their thinking. Each classroom has its own *Seed Box* for children to access, share and develop their ideas for thinking. Students will be encouraged to experiment with a variety of punctuation such as: capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. Correctly formed upper and lower case letters will continue to be modelled by the classroom teachers.

In Reading, students have established the *Independent Reading Process* in their classroom. The focus for this term has been to familiarize the children with strategies that will support them when choosing *just right* books. It is important for children to enjoy what they read and develop a passion for reading. Developing strategies that support comprehension will continue to be a focus this term.

In Speaking and Listening, students are encouraged to contribute to class discussion on a regular basis. Teachers have modelled the *whole body listening approach*, which is helping students to understand the benefits of listening attentively. All Year One classes have designated days for Show and Tell. Please check with your child (or their teacher) for their specified day. Opportunities for students to interact together will happen incidentally each day.

Mathematics:

In Number and Algebra, the focus for the remainder of term 1 will be:

- using number sequences to put numbers on a number line
- using our number knowledge to place numbers on a number line
- explore teen numbers
- investigate patterns
- count to make a number pattern
- use materials to show different ways of making a number eg: 4 and 2 more make 6, double 3 makes 6
- use counting on to solve addition problems

In Measurement and Geometry, the focus for the remainder of term 1 will be:

- exploring heavier, lighter and equal masses using pan balances and hefting
- measuring the length of 2 to 3 objects using concrete materials
- to learn the language of time: yesterday, today, tomorrow
- to learn about o'clock time

Inquiry: Thank you for the support you are providing your child with preparing their Timeline - Birth to 2 years old (see Compass for further details). All students will have an opportunity to share their timeline with their classmates before the end of term one.
